Background

This statement has been prepared for the purposes of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (“the Act”).

The issue of modern slavery

According to the International Labour Organisation, there are some 21 million people worldwide subjected to modern slavery. We do not tolerate modern slavery either within our business itself or within our supply chain. We expect our supply chain (whether direct suppliers or those that directly or indirectly supply our direct suppliers) to share the same values.
